Program

ON-LINE LEARNING

Introduced by Sally Lancaster and presented by Kevin Corbett.

Sally reported that Kevin is a master teacher starting the On-line program at Everett High 14 years ago. He has set very high goals for his program over the years and has surpassed his goals in educational technology and higher education.

Kevin has spent more than 30 years in education and recognized that On-line education was the way of the future and is today the fastest growing form of education in business and K-12 education. Billions of dollars are being spent on On-line education and leaders in business are using On-line education more and more. Currently 46% of college students have used

On-line learning and businesses that are using E-learning have boosted productivity by more than 50% and E-learning employees generate 26% more revenue and 17% of the business using E-learning are market leaders. On-line education is blasting off with an ever accelerating pace.



By 2019 estimates are that 50% of all courses will be on-line. Interestingly the Ivy League Schools had turned their noses up at On-line learning even though On-line learning has been around since the 60's before the world wide web. The growing trend is the MOOC (Massive Open On-line Course) which has opened the world to On-line learning after MIT and Stanford came together to create their program the EDX. There are currently 7,100,000 users, 641 courses available in 181 countries.

Kevin's program started 14 years ago with three students and now has 1500 students using the program. These students need to be self-motivated but have the advantage of being able

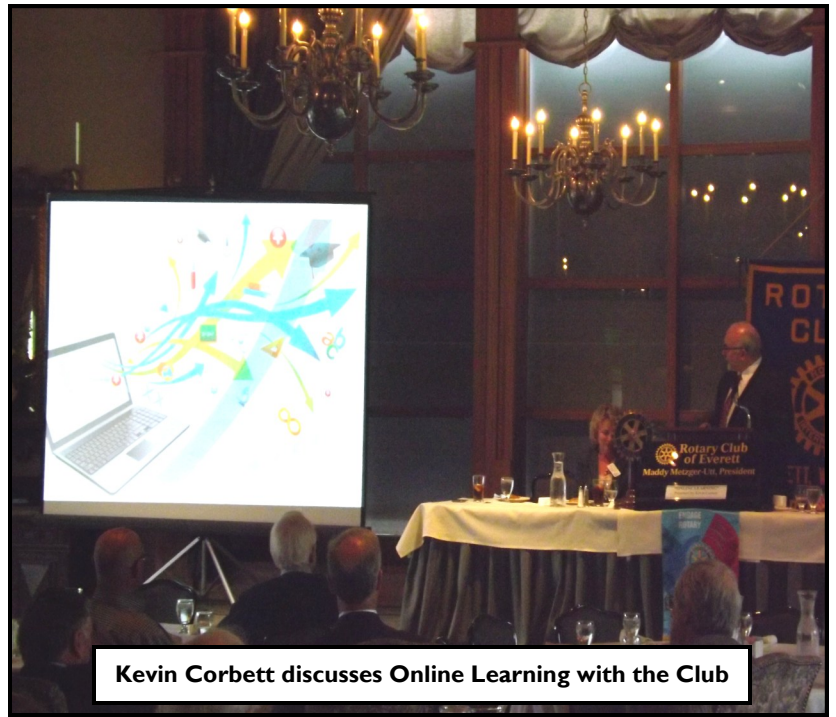


to access the programs 24hrs.

a day, 7 days a week which allows students to work, participate in high level sports, continue education even if they are not socially accepted in traditional school settings or even in medical cases where the student is not able to attend school. The Everett students have an 88% passing rating whereas nationally the passing rate is only 46%. The program was first designed for students to catch up with their classmates because they were falling behind in traditional classes but it has taken off as a way for students to accelerate their education and earn extra credits to further their educations.

With this program the school district dollars stay in the Everett School District and supports Everett teachers and Everett students only. This program is successful because the teachers are not high tech but high touch. They work well with the students and add the human attention and concerning adult interaction that makes the difference.

Kevin followed his program answering several questions from our fellow Rotarians who by the response of questions, tells me the program was enjoyed by all.
